


Somerset Youth & Community Service

What we do

Our mission is to help create a youth sector where Somerset's young people have their voices heard and have access to universal and open-access services which are coherent, sustainable and high quality.

Advice, information and support

Our staff are professionally qualified and experienced youth workers who advise communities which are starting new youth provision, or maintaining and developing existing provision. We maintain as much up to date information about the availability of youth provision as possible, and where this demonstrates a geographical gap we work with local organisations and parish councils to help them develop provision. We also offer a benchmark scheme which enables clubs to be recognised as 'Safe and Welcoming'.

Resources

These include the service-produced Community Youth Club Handbook; youth work session plans; a campaign calendar with quick and easy suggestions for youth work activities; DofE and youth voice initiatives; an entry-level accreditation package; a development programme for young volunteers; a development framework for local youth voice and youth council initiatives; outdoor learning, expedition and activity equipment, and our website (www.somersetyouth.co.uk) with information, links and downloadable resources.

Funding

We manage grant programmes including Youth and Community Group Grants which support universal, open access youth provision; Youth Bank which enables individual young people to access positive activities; West Somerset Essential Life Skills funding which improves access to extra-curricular activity programmes for groups and individuals in the West Somerset Opportunity Area. We also provide information about other appropriate sources of funding.



Case Study

Having received a grant last year, she joined her local Guides as a shy, tearful, under-confident 11 year old girl who didn't want to leave her mum. Since then she has blossomed and taken a full part in girlguiding activities, including gaining badges in First Aid, Party Planning, Football and "Life Wise" (skills for life). Other activities have included campfire-lighting and cooking, Remembrance Parade, bowling, trail-finding, outdoor and indoor games and lots of team-building. She attended a 2-night Guide Camp recently and happily slept in a tent, and played a full part in all activities including a blind-fold trail, campfire cooking competition, washing up, cleaning toilets, a night walk and underground tunnelling!


The young woman is now MUCH more self-confident and independent, has organised activities at guides, is reliable, friendly to others and particularly kind and helpful to newcomers and specifically another guide who has severe learning difficulties. Coming to guides gives her a break from her siblings and complex family situation. The grant has certainly made a difference to her life!

Youth & Community Group Grants 2017-18

Youth & Community Group Grants enable groups in Somerset to create or sustain universal, open-access youth clubs or drop-in provision for young people aged 11-19 and up to 25 for young people with special needs. Grant funding is backed up with professional youth work support and access to a wide range of resources, advice, information, training and monitoring.

It has provided the opportunity for young people in the village to have activities and a base outside of home and school in a safe and welcoming space. One young person said "I do not know if I could get through the week if I wasn't coming to youth club". Another said "very often it is the only time I go out apart from school". We are a rurally isolated village with no public transport so availability of an alternative to being at home is very welcome.

Benchmark Awards

Somerset Youth and Community Service developed the Benchmark scheme so that youth clubs can be easily recognised as a good place for young people to go. The scheme covers safety, sustainability and the 'young people friendliness' of the club.

The Benchmark Scheme has two levels:

'Safe and Welcoming' recognises clubs that achieve the basic safety standards and a level of welcoming provision for young people.

'Quality Youth Club' builds on Safe and Welcoming, adding elements of information and advice, young people's involvement in decision making and more stringent levels of child protection training and first aid cover.

Each level is split into four areas:

Programme – this looks at what young people experience at their club and what's available for them

People – this covers the people who contribute to, or work in, the club and their management and training

Policies – this covers the policies needed to run a club

Procedures and paperwork – everything else that needs to be in place.

Somerset UK Youth Parliament

Somerset's UK Youth Parliament is made up of three elected Members of Youth Parliament (MYPs) and three Deputies. They are supported by an Advisory Group of around 20 young people from all walks of life across the county.

Between April 2017 and January 2018 Advisory Group members committed a total of 2,330 hours to doing voluntary work representing Somerset's young people and communities.

This is equal to more than 62 weeks full time equivalent!

Affiliation Scheme

This year, Somerset Youth and Community Service introduced an affiliation scheme. The scheme is available to all any club or organisation which provides or supports open-access provision for young people aged 11-19.

Affiliation provides:

- support to set up new clubs and sustain existing clubs, including help and advice with:
 - policies
 - governance
 - health and safety (including risk assessments)
 - safeguarding
 - access to grant funding (terms and conditions apply, see website for details) and fundraising advice
- fulfilment of affiliation requirements for youth club insurance policies
- at least one visit per year from a qualified and experienced professional Youth & Community Officer to offer advice and support as required
- support and advice by email or telephone
- template policies and documents, as well as a range of youth work resources
- bespoke youth work training programmes
- accredited Basic Child Protection training for your staff and volunteers
- support for your club to achieve Benchmark awards
- access to Endeavour Credits, a way of formally recognising young people's achievements in their youth club
- monthly information bulletins, plus additional updates as relevant opportunities and information become available
- chance to advertise jobs, events etc on the 'News' section of our service website

Monthly bulletin

Youth Equipment Store

The Youth Equipment Store offers equipment for children and young people and the adults working with them to hire at extremely affordable rates from its base in Taunton. The store will also deliver to recognised groups across Somerset to ensure equipment is available to all young people. As well as the regular equipment, voluntary groups can rent a minibus or seven seat people carrier from the store.

YES has a range of equipment and toys for children and young people with disabilities and additional needs. These include everything from sensory toys to mobility aids.
